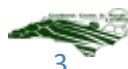

ONslow COUNTY FAIR PREMIUM LIST RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibits may be entered from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Monday the first day of the fair. **Exhibitors must be Onslow County residents.**
2. All exhibits must be removed between 8:30 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Monday after the fair closes.
3. The fair officials reserve the right to refuse entry of any unworthy exhibit.
4. Reasonable space will be allowed all exhibitors up to the capacity of the building space. Fair officials reserve the right to refuse additional entries.
5. In classes having only one entry, a premium will be awarded at the discretion of the judges. This applies to all departments.
6. The decision of the judges will be final and no appeal will be considered where it appears that fraud or deception has been attempted, or where the rules have not been observed.
7. The officers of the fair will withhold premiums in any case considered.
8. An exhibitor may not have more than one entry in each class. Youth may enter items in an adult category under a parents' name provided there is no youth class available (those entered under the youth's name will not be eligible for prize monies).
9. Exhibits will be judged on the second day of the fair.
10. Paintings entered in Division V will not be accepted if "done by numbers."
11. All clothing, needlework and baked items should be enclosed in clear plastic wrap or container.
12. All entries must have been made or produced ***within the last year, October 2015 – September 2016***, with the exception of livestock.
13. All EDUCATIONAL BOOTHS assigned through N.C. Cooperative Extension, Onslow County Center, on a "first come - first served" basis.
14. Limited small animal space available. **ONLY 5 pens** per exhibitor. Call fair management for reservation of small animal pens.
15. The Fair Association will employ police, guards and traffic directors, and will use diligence to promote safety and protection of patrons, their exhibits, and property on the fair grounds. Under no circumstances will the fair or any of its officers and employees be responsible for loss or damage to persons and their property (including entries, exhibits, automobiles in parking lots, and articles left in cars) because of accidents, theft, fire, the elements, or other conditions.

"GROWN IN THE COASTAL CAROLINA SUN"

GENERAL RULES

16. The Standard Flower Show conforms to the standards established in the NGC *Handbook for Flower Shows, 2007 Edition*.
17. All amateur growers and designers are welcome to enter this show.
18. Horticulture entries, DEPARTMENTS 'H' and 'J', must be entered Monday, October 3, 2016, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. & 4:30 p.m. Exception: plants blooming one day only (i.e.,



Hibiscus rosa-sinensis) may be entered Tuesday, October 4, 2016, between 8:00 & 9:00 a.m.

19. Design entries, DEPARTMENTS 'I' and 'J', may be entered either Monday, October 3, 2016, or Tuesday, October 4, 2016, during the hours specified above. Entries must be in place by 9:00 a.m. Tuesday, October 4, 2016. Designs must be pre-registered (Design Rule #40). A designer unable to fulfill an assignment is responsible to provide a substitute and notify Design Consultant.
20. An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class but may enter more than one class. Entry cards for exhibitors will be provided by show committee for classification information.
21. Plants on the state's native plants and conservation lists will not be used unless grown by the exhibitor and so stated on entry card. Do not use noxious plants.
22. Consultants for DEPARTMENTS 'H', 'I' and 'J' are active members of clubs in the Onslow Garden Club Council.
23. Classification Chairman will check all entries for conformance to schedule.
24. Fresh plant material will be emphasized throughout the show, and no artificial plant material may be used in any department.
25. Judging will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. by panels of three NGC approved judges on Tuesday, October 4, 2016, in accordance with the *Handbook for Flower Shows, 2007 Edition*. All decisions of the judges are based on the **NGC Standard System of Awarding** and are final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
26. The Scales of points (HB pages 297-304) for all competitive judging are based on perfection (100 points). According to the **NGC Standard System of Awarding**, each panel of judges may award only one 1st Place (blue) ribbon per class or sub-class (must score 90 or above); only one 2nd Place (red) ribbon per class or sub-class (must score 85 or above); only one 3rd Place (white) ribbon per class or sub-class (must score 75 or above). In this show, ribbons are offered for 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place. Monetary premiums are offered to 1st and 2nd Place winners only. Neither ribbons nor premiums will be offered for Honorable Mention.
27. Only the Chairman of the Show and the Classification Chairman will be present during judging.
28. All exhibits, DEPARTMENTS 'H', 'I', and 'J' must be removed from the show on Monday October 10, 2016 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00

DEPARTMENT 'H' – HORTICULTURE – LIVE PLANTS

"ALIVE IN COASTAL STYLE"

29. Each horticulture specimen must be fresh plant material grown by the exhibitor.
30. Plant material may not be altered by use of oils, 'leaf shine' products, etc., that may change the natural color or texture.
31. A clear glass container with no distracting markings, stable and in proportion to cut specimen/s entered (i.e., bud bases, bottles). Must be provided by exhibitor.
32. Cut specimen may have only one stem (unless specified otherwise) and no foliage below the water line (exception: Gladiolus)
33. Cut specimen may be wedged upright with a small amount of packing, bubble wrap, or other clear material. Maximum length of stem 30" unless otherwise specified.
34. Container-grown plants must have been in exhibitor's possession at least 90 days, except multiple and combination plantings which must have been in exhibitor's possession and growing together at least six weeks.
35. Containers for container-grown plants may not exceed 10" in diameter.
36. Double potting is permitted for container-grown plants.
37. One **NGC Award of Horticultural Excellence** (rosette of green, orange & blue ribbons) and one **\$25 OCGC Premium** will be awarded to the highest-scoring (95 or above), *correctly-labeled*, blue-ribbon exhibit in the entire Horticulture Department.
38. To qualify for the above awards, exhibit must be correctly identified by its binomial name (*genus plus species*) or its currently accepted scientific identification. Entry cards should be legibly HANDWRITTEN with genus (*underlined with first letter capitalized*), species (*all lower case and underlined*), variety (*all lower case and underlined*) and/or cultivar (*enclosed in*



39. *single quotes with first letter/s capitalized*) where applicable (HB 91-97). For example: Tagetes patula 'Lemon Drop; ' Rosa 'English Garden.

Reference may include many books, catalogs, and online resources. A common name may be added, but not substituted for the scientific name.

44. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruits, or vegetables are permitted.
45. Religious symbols must be used in a respectful manner.
46. American flag and other national flags may not be incorporated into any design.
47. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted.
48. Backgrounds and/or underlays may not be used with any design.
49. All living members of the Animal Kingdom, e.g., mammals, birds, fish, etc., are not permitted in any design.
50. Container-grown plants growing in soil, and living plants with roots attached are not permitted in any class.
51. Designs may not exceed 18” wide, 12” deep, or 32/30” high, unless stated otherwise. Staging will consist of risers.
52. A minimum of four designs are required in each of the below classes.
