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ONslow COUNTY FAIR PREMIUM LIST RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibits **MUST** be entered from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM on Monday, October 14, 2019. Exhibitors must be Onslow County residents.
2. All exhibits **MUST** be removed between 8:30 AM and noon on Monday, October 21, 2019 after the fair closes.
3. The fair officials reserve the right to refuse entry of any unworthy exhibit. Reasonable space will be allowed all exhibitors up to the capacity of the building space. Fair officials reserve the right to refuse additional entries. In classes having only one entry, a premium will be awarded at the discretion of the judges. This applies to all departments.
6. The decision of the judges will be final and no appeal will be considered where it appears that fraud or deception has been attempted, or where the rules have not been observed.
7. The officers of the fair will withhold premiums in any case considered.
8. An exhibitor may not have more than one entry in each class. Youth may enter items in an adult category under a parents' name provided there is no youth class available (those entered under the youth's name will not be eligible for prize monies).
9. Exhibits will be judged on the second day of the fair.
10. Paintings entered in Division V will not be accepted if "done by numbers."
11. All artwork must be mounted in a way that will allow it to be hung for display.
12. All clothing, needlework and baked items should be enclosed in clear plastic wrap or container.
13. All entries must have been made or produced **within the last two (2) years, October 2017 – September 2019**, with the exception of livestock. All EDUCATIONAL BOOTHS assigned through N.C. Cooperative Extension, Onslow County Center, on a "first come - first served" basis.
15. Limited small animal space available. ONLY 5 pens per exhibitor. Call fair management for reservation of small animal pens.
16. The Fair Association will employ police, guards and traffic directors, and will use diligence to promote safety and protection of patrons, their exhibits, and property on the fair grounds. Under no circumstances will the fair or any of its officers and employees be responsible for loss or damage to persons and their property (including entries, exhibits, automobiles in parking lots, and articles left in cars) because of accidents, theft, fire, the elements, or other conditions.

Due to Hurricane Florence, we are extending the "made or produced" dates to include items "made or produced" between October 2017 and September 2019. So, if you didn't get to show your item last year, you've still got a chance. See you at THE FAIR!

18. An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class but may enter more than one class. Entry cards for exhibitors will be provided by show committee for classification information.
19. Plants on the state's native plants and conservation lists will not be used unless grown by the exhibitor and so stated on the entry card. Do not use noxious plants.
20. Fresh plant material will be emphasized throughout the show, and no artificial plant material may be used in any department.
21. **Horticulture** entries, DEPARTMENTS 'H' and 'J', must be entered Monday, October 14, 2019, between the hours of 8:30 AM & 4:30 PM
Exception: plants blooming one day only (i.e., *Hibiscus rosa-sinensis*) may be entered Tuesday, October 15, 2019, between 8:00 & 9:00 AM

22. Design entries, DEPARTMENTS 'I' and 'J', may be entered either Monday, October 14, 2019, or Tuesday, October 15, 2019, during the hours specified above: Entries must be in place by 9:00 AM Tuesday, October 15, 2019.
23. Consultants for DEPARTMENTS 'H', 'I' and 'J' are active members of garden clubs in Onslow County.
24. Classification Chairman will check all entries for conformance to schedule. Classes will not be subdivided.
25. Judging will begin promptly at 10:00 AM by panels of three approved judges on Tuesday, October 15, 2019.
26. Only the judges, clerks and others deemed appropriate may be present during judging.
27. The Scales of Points for judging are based on perfection (100 points). Each panel of judges may award only one 1st Place (blue) ribbon per class; only one 2nd Place (red) ribbon per class; only one 3rd Place (white) ribbon per class. Monetary premiums are offered to 1st and 2nd Place winners only. Premiums are not offered for 3rd place.
28. All exhibits, DEPARTMENTS 'H', 'I', and 'J' must be removed from the show on Monday October 21, 2019 between 8:30 AM. & noon.

DEPARTMENT 'H' – HORTICULTURE – LIVE PLANTS

“ALIVE IN COASTAL STYLE”

29. Each horticulture specimen must be fresh plant material grown by the exhibitor.
30. Plant material may not be altered by use of oils, 'leaf shine' products, paint, stain, bleach, etc., that may change the natural color or texture.
31. Use a clear glass container with no distracting markings, stable and in proportion to cut specimen/s entered (i.e., bud bases, bottles). Exhibitors are encouraged to use their own containers.
32. Cut specimens may have only one stem (unless specified otherwise) and no foliage below the water line (exception: *Gladolius*)
33. Cut specimens may be wedged upright with a small amount of packing, bubble wrap, or other clear material. Maximum length of stem 30" unless otherwise specified.
34. Container-grown plants must have been in exhibitor's possession at least 90 days, except multiple and combination plantings which must have been in exhibitor's possession and growing together at least six weeks.
35. Containers for container-grown plants may not exceed 10" in diameter. Double potting is permitted for container-grown plants.
36. Exhibits must be correctly identified by binomial name (*genus plus species*) or its currently accepted scientific identification. Entry cards should be legibly HANDWRITTEN with genus, species, variety and/or cultivar, where applicable. For example:
Tagetes patula 'Lemon Drop'
Rosa 'English Garden'
37. Books, catalogs and online resources may be used for identification. A common name may be added, but not substituted for the scientific name.

4. All products must be processed according to recognized safe methods found in the current edition of the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning with the Ball Blue Book.
5. All jars must be labeled ONLY as to content, processing method (pressure canner or boiling water bath) and processing time. ENTRIES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF NOT LABELED OR IF LABELS CONTAIN ADDITIONAL INFORMATION, i.e. YOUR NAME.

39. Design must be the work of one individual. An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class but may enter more than one class.
40. Plant material may be from any source. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner. Each design must contain some FRESH plant material.
41. The treatment (i.e., painting, bleaching, dyeing) of dried plant material is permitted.
42. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruits, or vegetables are permitted.
43. Religious symbols must be used in a respectful manner.
44. American flag and other national flags may not be incorporated into any design.
45. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted.
46. Backgrounds and/or underlays may not be used with any design.
47. Live animals (e.g., mammals, birds, fish, etc.) are not permitted in any design.
48. Container-grown plants growing in soil, and living plants with roots attached are not permitted.
49. Designs may not exceed 18" wide, 12" deep, or 32" high, unless stated otherwise. Staging will consist of risers.

- I-1 "BABY STEPS" May use a baby shoe/s, (ceramic or real). Designer's choice of plant materials and other components. Dimensions must not exceed 8" in height, width, or depth.
- I-2 "MY SPECIAL HAT" Hats may not exceed 12" in height, width or depth. Hats may be vintage, modern or may represent a specific event or culture. Designer's choice of plant materials and other components to complete the style.
- I-3 "DRESSED TO KILL" Lovely or outrageous dress shoe/s with designer's choice of plant material. Design not to exceed 12" wide, 8" deep, 15" high.
- I-4 "ENCHANTED DINING DOWN EAST" A centerpiece using your choice of design style or design type, plant materials, and components. For amateurs who have not won a blue ribbon in a flower show.
